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From the Department



Dear students of the English Department,

As far as we know, we all – students, staff and faculty – made it through these trying times in reasonably good health. Despite multiple disruptions and problems in teaching, examining, counseling and research, we all did our best to ensure that students could earn the credits needed and faculty and staff could fulfill their tasks in the best possible manner.

Doubtlessly, there have been instances when not all expectations from the various groups could be met and deficiencies in the way the university has been operating have been exposed. All the while, we are hoping that this will not be the new normal, even though there probably won't be a full return to pre-corona conditions. We are all called on to identify positive aspects of this enforced wave of digitalization, so

that we can keep, and possibly enhance, teaching methods and strategies that have proved positively working and even beneficial.

Creative ideas are always appreciated. And we hope to welcome you all back in the fall in good health and spirits. Enjoy the rest of your summer and stay safe!
