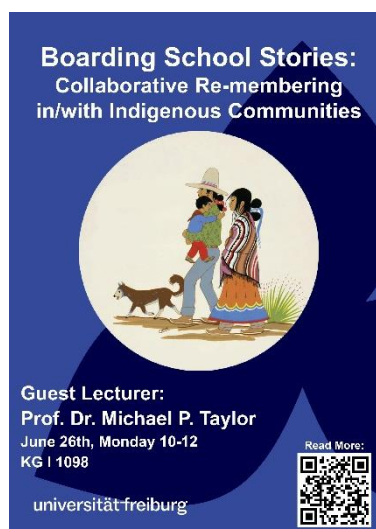

Guest Lecture | *Boarding School Stories: Collaborative Re-membering in/with Indigenous Communities*

Prof. Dr. Michael P. Taylor will give a guest lecture on **Boarding School Stories: Collaborative Re-membering in/with Indigenous Communities**:



Intended to erase all traces of Indigenous kinship and cultural identity, and thereby forever extinguish tribal claims to Indigenous lands and waters, **Indian boarding/residential schools** continue to influence the **intergenerational realities** and resulting narratives of what it means to be Indigenous in settler states and in Indigenous communities today. While the forced removal of tens of thousands of Indigenous children from their homelands/waters, languages, and kinship networks continues to negatively impact Indigenous populations, Indigenous communities have remained resilient, developing communal ways of ensuring cultural continuity and healing that sustain ongoing acts of individual and collective resurgence.

Dr. Taylor's research brings together **community-centered stories** surrounding Indian boarding/residential schooling and the ongoing impacts across generations and across Turtle Island (North America). His work is especially interested in the diverse ways through which Indigenous students, survivors, and their descendants have remembered, reclaimed, and even reconciled boarding/residential school stories.

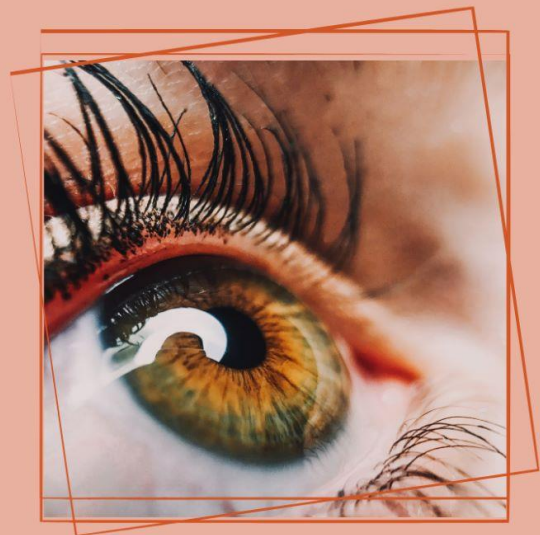

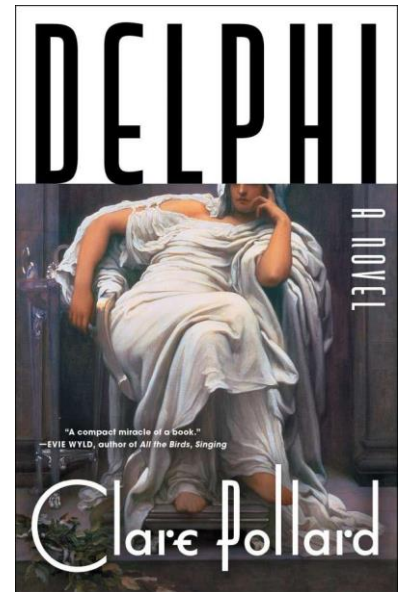

The **LitCult Colloquium** has been renamed to **Contemporary Literature Book Club!** The book club is a meeting group intended for the discussion of contemporary literature in the English language. Students, faculty, and staff are always welcome to join us.

This month, the group will discuss **Clare Pollard's *Delphi* (2022)**.

Covid-19 has arrived in London, and the entire world quickly succumbs to the surreal, chaotic mundanity of screens, isolation, and the disasters big and small that have plagued recent history. As our unnamed narrator — a classics professor immersed in her studies of ancient prophecies — navigates the tightening grip of lockdown, a marriage in crisis, and a ten-year-old son who seems increasingly unreachable, she becomes obsessed with predicting the future. Shifting her focus from chiromancy (prophecy by palm reading) to zoomancy (prophecy by animal behavior) to oenomancy (prophecy by wine), she fails to notice the future creeping into the heart of her very own home, and when she finally does, the threat has already breached the gates.

Reading Games | **Dredge (2023)**

Reading Games (as in "we are reading games," not as if a series of gamified reading sessions) is a book club for video games instead of books.



The club meets (currently online) on a monthly basis to talk about **selected games**, from an **interdisciplinary perspective**, including Cultural Studies and literary approaches. In order to join, you don't have to have any level of knowledge of video games, or define yourself as a "gamer." That term is becoming as meaningful as a term like "movie-goer," in today's world, where digital games are everywhere as cultural products.

This session, the club will start their new theme **Traversal** by discussing **Dredge (2023)**.

Dredge is a single-player fishing adventure with a sinister undercurrent. Sell your catch, upgrade your boat, and dredge the

depths for long-buried secrets. Explore a mysterious archipelago and discover why some things are best left forgotten.

This time, there is also a selected reading: **Gerald Farca**, *Playing Dystopia: Nightmarish Worlds in Video Games and the Player's Aesthetic Response* (2018).

This book is recommended to participants who want to engage with the selected games on a more critical level. The text will be referred to in the discussions, but reading is optional. The book is available [via the University of Freiburg library](#).
