NEW FACES AT THE ENGLISH DEPARTMENT

Dear Everyone at the English Department!

I have had the great pleasure to have started teaching, and working, and meeting new people and old friends and colleagues, and having great conversations, and doing research, and having coffees and lunches and dinners, and reading books, and having administrative meetings, and reading student essays, and listening to fascinating talks and ideas at the English Department and beyond at Freiburg University – and you can't know how much I am looking forward to about twenty more years of doing exactly that, and much else!

I set foot in KG IV for the first time in October 1997 and, in spirit, never left...! I studied English, German, and Political Science in Freiburg, and after a year abroad at UT Austin, Texas, during my studies and a year as a lecturer at Yale after I had finished,

I settled on American literature and worked on my PhD under the mentorship of the late Manfred Pütz and then Monika Fludernik. I taught American literature in Freiburg and worked with Sieglinde Lemke in 2008/09, and then moved on to work with Greta Olson at Giessen university, whom I had also met first at KG IV. After a much extended PostDoc period (life, luckily, sometimes gets in between things!) and research stays in Amherst, Worcester, and Irvine, I stood in as a professor for Michael Butter in Tübingen twice (I met him at KG III in 1997) – and started my Heisenberg Fellowship there in April of this year, before being appointed Heisenberg Professor in Freiburg.

As a researcher and teacher, I am interested in many aspects of, and many angles of looking at, American literature and culture – and I am sure we'll engage in many detailed conversations about those in the future. Most broadly speaking, three hearts are beating my chest: the heart of a narratologist interested in form, the heart of a cultural studies researcher interested in power structures and literature's part in helping us understand the world, past and present, and making it a better place, and the heart of the literary sociologist, interested in the people who are "doing" literature not only by writing, but by reading, marketing, buying, discussing, and evaluating it.

I hope to meet many more of you in person soon and look forward to being part of a community of people who think hard, read much, inspire each other, and enjoy each other's company –





This month, the group will discuss **Torrey Peters' Stag Dance (2025)**



Deep in the forest, a group of restless lumberjacks working an illegal logging outfit plan a winter dance that some will volunteer to attend as women; the broadest, strongest axeman finds himself caught in a rivalry with a pretty, young jack that culminates in jealousy, betrayal and an astonishing spectacle of transition. Meanwhile, in other times and places, the gender apocalypse is brought about by an unstable ex-girlfriend; an illicit boarding-school romance surfaces intrigue and cruelty; and a Las Vegas party weekend turns dark when a young crossdresser must choose between a thrilling mystery man or a veteran trans woman offering unglamorous sisterhood.
