NEW FACE AT THE ENGLISH DEPARTMENT Dana Serditova



Hi everyone,

It is debatable how much of a new face I am in the English department, as I've just completed my PhD here, but I am very happy to introduce myself in a new capacity. Starting in October, I will be working as a postdoc under Prof. Kortmann and teaching two courses this winter semester: Introduction to Sociolinguistics and Linguistic Variation in Urban North America. My PhD , titled "Salience in New Orleans English," aimed to identify and describe several features of New Orleans English, such as the PIN~PEN merger, /I/vocalization, and /aɪ/monophthonaization. Consequently, my research interests revolve around sociolinguistics, (socio)phonetics and

phonology, and all things language variation and change. I have studied dialectal features in North America, England, and Australia, so my research has a broad geographic scope. My postdoc project will be situated at the intersection of sociolinguistics and speech technology and will be conducted in collaboration with researchers from Heinrich-Heine-Universität Düsseldorf, Hochschule Düsseldorf, and Newcastle University. It aims to investigate how users adapt their speech when they interact with dialect-sensitive versus neutral automatic speech recognition (ASR) systems. You are welcome to contact me with research project ideas in sociolinguistics, dialectology, phonetics and phonology, ASR, human-machine interaction, Al-induced language change, and other similar fields.

I look forward to meeting many of you in Introduction to Sociolinguistics or Linguistic Variation in Urban North America in October! Until then, feel free to say hi by sending me an <u>email</u>.

- Support core staff with the preparation of materials for students and courses
- Update online student learning platforms, such as Moodle, with current information for students
- Perform routine maintenance tasks to ensure a tidy, inviting space for students and faculty

Orientation, Field Trips and Other Events:

• Participate in and support with all aspects of student orientation week at the start of each semester (August 26 – September 1, 2024; January 14 – 19, 2025; February 24 – March 2, 2025)

• Aid students as they adjust to a new environment and support them throughout their stay

• Cooperate with core staff to organize student events and field trips, which staff assistant may also be asked to participate in

Required Skills/Qualifications:

- Enrollment at an institution of higher education or equivalent establishment
- Fluent in English and German (written and spoken)
- Good organizational skills and strong computer skills (Word, Excel, PowerPoint)
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Sensitivity to cultural differences, ideally with experience living/studying abroad
- Inclusive attitude and ability to deal with many people at once

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

Global Studies Program

The Global Studies Programme, initiated in 2001, is a two-year master's degree programme. The main objective of the programme is to study various cultures and regions within the social sciences, focusing on the Global South. The GSP is conducted jointly by the University of Freiburg (Germany), the University of Cape Town (South Africa), Jawaharlal Nehru University (New Delhi, India), FLACSO Argentina (Buenos Aires) and Chulalongkorn University (Bangkok). Within the GSP, students learn to approach the world and globalization from various regional perspectives and disciplines, comprising sociology, political sciences, anthropology, and cultural geography. The programme's global and multicultural experience is enhanced by the diversity of its students who study at different places around the world together. Each group comprises students from all parts of the world. The programme received many high-ranking awards including the BMW Group Award for Intercultural Learning (2004) and the Top Ten International Master's Programme title by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and the Stifterverband für die Deutsche Wissenschaft (2006). In 2011 these successes were confirmed again with the reaccreditation of the GSP in Germany. Since 2001, more than six hundred and fifty students from over sixty countries on all the continents have participated in the programme. From mid-April the programme begins every year with the summer semester in Freiburg. In their second semester, students can choose between FLACSO Argentina in Buenos Aires or Cape Town University, while for their third semester students have the choice between Jawaharlal Nehru University in New Delhi or Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok. In the fourth semester, students return to Freiburg for their MA thesis and final examination. The application deadline for the GSP intake of 2025 is November 30th, 2024. The online application

portal is only open from September 15th 2024 to November 30th 2024. Between September and November there will be two virtual information events for everyone interested in the programme, more information and the exact dates will be published on our website.

READING GAMES Venba (2023)

Reading Games (as in "we are reading games," not as if a series of gamified reading sessions) is a book club for video games instead of books.

Reading Games is a discussion group meeting on a monthly basis to talk about digital games, examining them from an interdisciplinary perspective, including literary and cultural studies approaches. The meetings take place **between 18:30-20:00 pm on the second Wednesday of each month**, **in room 4008 (KG IV) and via Discord (hybrid)** and are open to all students, faculty members, and external guests. Participants are expected to complete a playthrough of the selected game in advance of each session.



In August, the club will continue their theme Food by discussing Venba (2023).

Venba is a short narrative cooking game, where you play as an Indian mom who immigrates to Canada with her family in the 1980s. Cook various dishes and restore lost recipes, hold branching conversations, and explore South Indian food in this story about family, love, and loss.
