## TALK

### ***Negated fragment answers in English: A discourse-oriented and construction-based perspective***

**Prof. Dr. Jong-Bok Kim** (President of the Linguistics Society Korea; Kyung Hee University of Seoul) will be giving the talk "**Negated fragment answers in English: A discourse-oriented and construction-based perspective**".

Fragment answers involve a type of ellipsis that occurs in answers to questions and these answers can be hosted by the negator 'not' (e.g., What was his motive? Not money.). The central research questions for such a negative fragment answer concern what licenses the fragment, how we can obtain a sentential meaning from its nonsentential status, and what is its syntactic structure. In attempting to answer these questions, there have been two main approaches: deletion-based sentential approaches and surface-oriented nonsentential approaches. This paper first discusses attested corpus data of such negated fragment answers that could challenge both directions and then argues for a direct interpretation (DI) nonsentential approach in which the interpretation of negative fragments is achieved by discourse machinery. The suggested approach shows that once we have a system that represents structured discourse structures, we could have straightforward mapping relations from a negated fragment answer to a proper propositional meaning.

### ***Pop Culture and Democracy: Opportunities, Challenges, and the Way Forward***

The PhD and early Career conference “**Popular Culture and Democracy: Opportunities, Challenges, and the Way Forward**”, organized by PhD candidates in British and North American literary and cultural studies at the University of Freiburg, Germany, will take place from **October 24 - 26 2024**. The conference warmly welcomes **interdisciplinary approaches and contributions on topics targeting the connection of popular culture and democracy in the English-speaking world**. Papers can include topics on specific popular culture products and mediums, or a particular approach to the topic from postcolonial studies, gender studies, queer studies, political theory and other perspectives.

We invite proposals for individual papers, on topics that can include, but are not limited to:

- The intersection of populism and popular culture
- Popular culture, conspiracy theories, and anti-democratic sentiments
- Heroes / villains in popular culture and their relationship with democratic structures
- Post- & De- colonial approaches and representations of BIPOC rights in popular culture
- Representations of Indigeneity and Indigenous sovereignty in popular culture
- Images of (in)justice, political activism, and resistance in popular culture
- (Anti-)democratic ideologies in, for example, popular music or video games
- Representations of legal frameworks within the popular culture landscape
- Social media platforms and democracy
- Utopian / dystopian projections of democracy's future in popular culture
- Popular culture's representation of natural disasters or pandemics, and their underlying political agenda
- Genre-specific representations of democracy, e.g. in horror, comedy, or science fiction



## CONTEMPORARY LITERATURE BOOK CLUB

### *Open Throat* (2023)

The **Contemporary Literature Book Club** is a meeting group intended for the discussion of contemporary literature in the English language. Students, faculty, and staff are always welcome to join us.

This month, the group will discuss **Henry Hoke, Open Throat** (2023)



A queer and dangerously hungry mountain lion lives in the drought-devastated land under the Hollywood sign. Lonely and fascinated by humanity's foibles, the lion spends their days protecting the welfare of a nearby homeless encampment, observing obnoxious hikers complain about their trauma, and, in quiet moments, grappling with the complexities of their gender identity, memories of a vicious father, and the indignities of sentience. "I have so much language in my brain," our lion says, "and nowhere to put it."

When a man-made fire engulfs the encampment, the lion is forced from the hills down into the city the hikers call "ellay." As the lion confronts a carousel of temptations and threats, they take us on a tour that spans the cruel inequalities of Los Angeles and the toll of climate grief, while scrambling to avoid earthquakes, floods, and the noise of their own conflicted psyche. But even when salvation finally seems within reach, they are forced to face down the ultimate question: Do they want to eat a person, or become one?


