PUBLICATION "Travel in Victorian Periodicals, 1850-1900"

Barbara Korte has recently published the monograph "Travel in Victorian Periodicals, 1850-1900":

This is the first study to explore the connections between the development of travel and the rapid expansion of the periodicals market in the second half of the nineteenth century in Britain. By the 1860s, travel articles had become a staple of the periodicals market and reached readers who might never have travelled far themselves or bought a travel book. This monograph demonstrates that the representation of travel in Victorian periodicals came in forms and with cultural functions that differed from book publication, and that this media-specific representation helped to inscribe travel into the Victorian lifeworld. Based on a corpus of several general-interest periodicals targeted at different audiences, this book investigates how different readers - the family, women, young people and the working classes - engaged with travel. It argues that travel articles in periodicals performed significant cultural work because they accommodated readers to travel.

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS Global Studies Program

The Global Studies Programme, initiated in 2001, is a two-year master's degree programme. The main objective of the programme is to study various cultures and regions within the social sciences, focusing on the Global South. The GSP is conducted jointly by the University of Freiburg (Germany), the University of Cape Town (South Africa), Jawaharlal Nehru University (New Delhi, India), FLACSO Argentina (Buenos Aires) and Chulalongkorn University (Bangkok). Within the GSP, students learn to approach the world and globalization from various regional perspectives and disciplines, comprising sociology, political sciences, anthropology, and cultural geography. The programme's global and multicultural experience is enhanced by the diversity of its students who study at different places around the world together. Each group comprises students from all parts of the world. The programme received many high-ranking awards including the BMW Group Award for Intercultural Learning (2004) and the Top Ten International Master's Programme title by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and the Stifterverband für die Deutsche Wissenschaft (2006). In 2011 these successes were confirmed again with the reaccreditation

of the GSP in Germany. Since 2001, more than six hundred and fifty students from over sixty countries on all the continents have participated in the programme. From mid-April the programme begins every year with the summer semester in Freiburg. In their second semester, students can choose between FLACSO Argentina in Buenos Aires or Cape Town University, while for their third semester students have the choice between Jawaharlal Nehru University in New Delhi or Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok. In the fourth semester, students return to Freiburg for their MA thesis and final examination. The application deadline for the GSP intake of 2025 is November 30th, 2024. The online application portal is only open from September 15th 2024 to November 30th 2024. Between September and November there will be two virtual information events for everyone interested in the programme, more information and the exact dates will be published on our website.

Was sind Ihre Aufgaben?

Der Arbeitsumfang beträgt 12 Stunden pro Woche. Aufgabe der Sprachassistent*innen besteht darin, den Unterricht und dielnhalte der Deutschkurse, die von den Professoren dreimal wöchentlich (Montag-Mittwoch-Freitag) angeboten werden, zu vertiefen. Der Schwerpunkt liegt auf Grammatikübungen une Sprachtraining. Die Studierenden verfügen in der Regel über keine oder nur sehr geringe Deutschkenntnisse. Darüber hinaus ist die Sprachassistent*in an der Organisation von Festen (z.B. Oktoberfest, Fasching/Karneval), Filmreihen, Abendessen, usw. beteiligt. Die Sprachassistent*innen müssen pro Trimester 1-2 Kurse sowie zwei "Praktika"-Workshops mit anderen internationalen Sprachassistent•innen belegen.

Wer kann sich bewerben?

Diese Ausschreibung richtet sich in erster Linie an Lehramtsstudierende, da diese bereits Erfahrung sowohl in der Planung als auch in der methodischen Gestaltung von Unterricht verfügen. Die Bewerbung steht jedochauch Studierenden anderer Studiengänge offen, sofern ein Bildungsabschluss und pädagogische Qualifikationen nachgewiesen werden können. Da es sich um einen einjährigen Aufenthalt handelt, sollten sich die Studierenden zum Zeitpunkt der Bewerbung mindestens im 5. Semester befinden. In Paris, a woman is attacked by a stranger in the street. Her attacker flees, but not before turning around to contemplate her victim, like an artist stepping back from a canvas.

At the age of twenty-two, the painter G leaves home for a new life in another country, far from the disapproval of her parents. Her paintings attract the disapproval of the man she later marries.

When a mother dies, her children confront her legacy: the stories she told, the roles

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Parade is a novel that demolishes the conventions of storytelling. It surges past the limits of identity, character, and plot to tell the story of G, an artist whose life contains many lives. Rachel Cusk is a writer and visionary like no other, who turns language upside down to show us our world as it really is
