- A reading course will precede the trip on 12th-14th March, 9-13h, Zoom. Attendance in this course is required for those who are participating in the study trip for credit. It is voluntary (but highly recommended) for other participants.
- The reading course also counts as part of the PS Cultural Studies (SL) "Political Shakespeare / Commercial Shakespeare" for BA students. The second part of this Proseminar will encompass two more block sessions in the summer term (Thursday afternoon).
