Inhalte

This is the standard introductory lecture for English linguistics to be taken in combination with the practical class "Doing Linguistics". On the one hand, it will provide an introduction to the scientific study of language, i.e. it will introduce you to the basic terminology and the major theories and methods developed in linguistics. On the other hand, it will illuminate you on the distinctive properties of the (Standard) English sound system, vocabulary and grammar, the major contrasts between English and German, and the geographic and social variability of English as well as English as a world language. Ultimately, this lecture should be understood as an exercise in linguistic consciousness-raising, trying to reveal everything you always knew about language(s), English in particular, but never dared (or cared) to ask. Although participation in this lecture is compulsory, participants may be assured that the lecturer has all good intentions of making this class a true invitation to linguistics.

The structure and contents of this course will be largely based on Kortmann (2005); the weekly reading assignments will be taken from this book and from one of the introductions to English linguistics given above. **For Meeting 1 please read Chapter 1 in Kortmann (2005).**

NOTE: This lecture will be accompanied by the practical class "Doing Linguistics", which will give you the opportunity to discuss issues touched upon in the lecture in greater depth and, above all, to work with data and engage in first little projects. Attending this practical class is obligatory: the coursework done in this class will count to your overall grade in the unit "Introduction to Linguistics".

Inhalte

Over the last years, cognitive aging has attracted a great deal of scholarly attention, partly due to the global demographic trend towards aging populations and the economic, medical and social challenges this poses. While cognitive aging research has mostly focused on age-related deficits, it has also been acknowledged that certain cognitive functions might be preserved or even improve as a function of age. A possible candidate for a cognitive ability that might remain largely intact across the life span is language comprehension. However, the neuro- functional underpinnings and the pervasiveness of this presumed resilience to age (both across individuals and across language levels like sounds, meaning and grammar) are still a matter of considerable debate. The present lecture series will introduce students to the state of the art and current debates around the topic of cognitive aging and language processing on the basis of talks given by leading researchers in this field.

Inhalte

This lecture will offer a survey of the sociohistorical background and the distinctive properties of the major urban and regional accents and dialects currently spoken in the British Isles, including the Celtic Englishes. We will also review the current situation of Received Pronunciation (including a quick look at how the Queen's speech has changed over the last 60 years) and discuss phenomena of ongoing change due to migration, large-scale commuting, and media influence.

Inhalte

This course is designed specifically for students wishing to become teachers. Its primary aim is to show to what extent linguistics is relevant to English teachers at German secondary schools and how linguistic research and resources can be applied in the language classroom. Inhalte

This course provides an introduction to the rapidly growing field of corpus linguistics, focusing on data from the British Isles. It aims to familiarise students with purposes and key concepts of corpus linguistic research as well as with (benefits and challenges of) different corpus types. Moreover, methods and tools in the construction and analysis of language corpora are introduced and tested. The corpus we focus on is the [Freiburg Corpus of English Dialects \(FRED\)](#), a database with spoken dialect data from all over the British Isles, which has recently been made available online. Using FRED, students are given hands-on experience in transcribing, annotating and searching a corpus, for example, by means of the programme [AntConc](#). Criteria for evaluating the quality of methods and analytical tools are also discussed.

Inhalte

This class is aimed at students who are eager to employ rigorous scientific methods in developing and evaluating their own SLA teaching materials.

A brief overview of the kind of problems that can occur in Second Language Acquisition will provide the necessary theoretical background. Following that, participants will get hands-on experience with different (software) tools that will enable them to plan simple production and perception tests, collect data in a semi-automatic way, and perform sound analyses of these data using (very!) simple statistical tests.

Under the guidance of the instructor, students will then choose a particular problem, design suitable training material for classroom use, and devise a test to evaluate the efficiency of said material in a scientifically reliable way. All aspects of this small-scale project will be presented orally in class (not marked).

Oral examination will be largely (but not exclusively) based on these projects as well.

Topics will (mostly) come from phonology, but since the primary focus is on the general methodology the skills acquired in this class should be easily transferable to other areas.

PLEASE NOTE: Participation in a project (and the oral presentation that goes with it) is obligatory for every participant, irrespective of whether they need credit for this class.

Inhalte

This class aims to consolidate and deepen your knowledge of English syntax. Starting from authentic examples of spoken and written language, we will examine a wide range of topics in English grammar (including different kinds of phrases, the structure of clauses and sentences, information packaging constructions like passives and clefts, negation, comparison, etc.), compare different ways of analysing structures and learn the basics of coherent syntactic argumentation. Special attention will also be devoted to describing the grammatical features of non-standard varieties of English.

Lernziele

The students will extend their knowledge of language and discourse to this (relatively) new field of communication, learning about key linguistic and social characteristics of computer-mediated communication and about linguistic research carried out in the New Media.

Inhalte

This seminar explores different aspects of communication in the new media, and ways of doing linguistic research on new media.

In this course, we will look at computer-mediated communication (CMC) particularly in the context of recent developments such as the emergence of the participatory “Web 2.0” and various social network sites, but without forgetting earlier modes of CMC either. We will identify key features of language use in various CMC contexts and learn about key research done in the field. Focus is particularly on sociolinguistic CMC research and the role of language in the identity construction of New Media users. Other topics include online communities, multilingualism, norms, and the effects of the Internet on language and society.

Inhalte

Pragmatics deals with language in context. One of the principal goals of pragmatic theory is to answer the question why language users invariably "mean" more than what they "literally" say and how hearers can come to understand the specific meaning a speaker communicates in a particular context. Several important strands in pragmatics can be traced to the works of philosophers, such as Grice, Austin and Searle. We will address some of the key ideas of these thinkers, as well as essential points of criticism that have been raised against their accounts from various perspectives. Topics to be discussed include the following: speech act theory (a philosophical approach which views utterances as a means of carrying out actions), Grice's theory of conversational implicatures (a philosophical approach which tries to bridge the gap between the context-independent meaning of a sentence and the meaning conveyed by a speaker in a specific context), and Conversation Analysis (an approach developed by sociologists and linguists, partly in response to speech act theory). To get a general feel for some of the issues pragmatics is concerned with, students interested in this seminar are requested to take a look at Chapman (2011: pp. 1-32).

Inhalte

This seminar unites two concerns of language teachers and professionals: the universal human activity of telling stories and the formidable challenge of expressing time in language. Why do narrators use Simple Past or Past Progressive to grab their readers' attention? When is it appropriate to report that *the car passed* as opposed to *was passing the truck* just before an accident?

English predicates must carry a tense/aspect ending, whose meaning often differs from German. In this seminar, we will explore the meaning of tense and aspect and its use in different kinds of texts (narratives, recounts, academic papers). Another major concern of this seminar are the cognitive mechanisms involved in processing tense/aspect. We will discuss pertinent psycholinguistic studies dealing with tense/aspect comprehension and familiarize ourselves with psycholinguistic methods used in this line of research. We will furthermore model how language teachers can integrate tense/aspect into their lesson plans and practice applying tense/aspect language objectives to (literary) texts of your choice. Effective teaching strategies, which students can use later in their own classrooms, will be demonstrated throughout.

Inhalte

This seminar takes demonstrative pronouns and interrogative pronouns, as well as the phrases containing them, as a point of departure for the analysis of a variety of structures and thematic domains in English and other languages.

Demonstratives (Engl. *this, that, there, then*, etc.) are referential expressions whose use is typically accompanied by gestures and whose reference can only be determined if the situation of utterance is known. They are acquired early in language learning and are lost late in aphasia. One of their most basic function is the establishing of a joint focus of attention, a function that can already be observed in the communicative behaviour of small children (Daddy, there!), but never in that of primates. Like their formally related interrogative counterparts (Engl. *what, which, where, when, why, how*, etc.), they have a very simple semantic structure, which includes a content component (person, object, place, time, reason, manner, etc.) and a deictic component (distance from the speaker or addressee) for demonstratives and an interrogative component (information gap to be filled by an answer) for interrogatives. Both classes of function words belong to an elementary layer of language, i.e. unlike many other grammatical markers, they are not derived from other expressions, but have given rise to a wide variety of other grammatical categories, such as relative pronouns, anaphors and cataphors, quotative markers, conjunctive adverbs, comparative constructions, degree adverbs (boosters), exclamative constructions, etc.

The study and analysis of demonstratives and interrogatives thus provide a highly suitable entry point and opportunity for the analysis of a wide variety of linguistic and communicative structures:

- The study of deixis (dependence of meaning on the situation of utterance)
- The study of gestures and their interaction with verbal means of communication (embodied cognition)
- The development of grammar (grammaticalization) from lexical elements and function words
- Difference in the development of related languages (e.g. the loss of the gestural use of *so* and *such* in English; the loss of demonstratives and interrogatives for the category of direction (*hither, thither; hence, thence – whither; whence*) in English, etc.)
- The syntax and semantics of function words: their distribution and category membership and the fundamental role of their meaning
- Variability of the relevant domain in varieties of English

Pronunciation has long been a neglected child in teacher training. As a result, teachers often feel ill equipped for the task of teaching pronunciation due to lack of background knowledge. This seminar sets out to fill this gap with a discussion of the following topics: contrastive phonology of German and English, phonetic acquisition processes, pronunciation research, the relation between perception and production, classification of errors and error gravity, ways of assessing errors, pronunciation instruction research including instruction technology as well as social and psychological aspects of accent training. It involves dealing with research publications on the topic but also practical work at school and is available as a Hauptseminar and as a Proseminar depending on your needs (6 or 8 credits).

The novel is a fairly young genre. Entering the American literary stage in the late Eighteenth century and met with suspicion at first, it was soon to become the first popular mass medium of American culture. It is indeed fair to say that over the course of the Nineteenth century American literary production fell under the auspices of the new genre. This lecture traces this development from its beginnings in the late Eighteenth until the end of the Nineteenth century. In doing so, it pays special attention to the main literary epochs of this time (Romanticism, Realism, Naturalism), the emergence of particular subgenres (such as gothic and sentimental fiction, the historical novel, the romance novel, the *Bildungsroman*), the changing functions of fiction, the changing profession of the writer, and the gradual consolidation of the literary market.

Inhalte

Theater and drama have held a prominent role in negotiating the premises of the social, political and intellectual constructions of American culture. We can observe a shift from author-based dramatic production towards actor-focused theatrical forms, happenings and a toppling of the fourth wall since the 1960s, and most recently, an apparent return towards author-oriented expression. The proseminar will explore American drama for its responses to social change and will also ask to what extent it remains a driving force in these transformations. Ultimately, the proseminar is driven by the question of whether drama constitutes a cultural site to negotiate what constitutes 'America.'

The proseminar proposes to read the American stage throughout its history as a seismograph of social change, a tool of political activism, and a channel for cultural critique. How are cultural transformations since WW II reflected in playwrighting and doing theater? The plays we will read are selected for their formal and topical innovations as well as for their concepts of authorship; we will take them as a starting point for understanding the development of American drama and theater since 1945. We will study the plays for their commentary on social and political attitudes in post-war American society, in the light of diversifying concepts of national identity in the wake of the civil rights movement and also as declared political instruments in building awareness for domestic issues such as ethnicity, feminism or gay pride as well as global questions such as the U.S. role in international conflicts. The course is designed to enable students to understand the contemporary American theater scene with a view to American theatrical traditions and dramatic conventions as well as topical reflections of central cultural concerns of the respective decades and movements.

Lehrmethoden

On the basis of close readings and scholarly approaches participants will learn how to foster reading motivation amongst students by getting to know a broad array of methods to fictional texts in the classroom.

Inhalte

Why is it that certain filmic and literary texts have become canonized in the EFL classroom to the extent that generations of English learners have been and will be exposed to them? To answer this question we will probe into the potential that these fictional texts can have for teenagers in general and teaching English in particular. Not limited to any one genre in particular we will look at novels (e.g. G. Orwell), dramas (e. g. A. Miller), poetry (e. g. W. Shakespeare), short stories (e. g. E. A. Poe), etc.

Inhalte

Nine out of ten marriages in Germany are bi-national marriages. But even though intermarriage is so common, and "multiethnic" individuals such as the Boateng brothers, Xavier Naidoo or Samy Deluxe are very present in the media, Germany is only beginning to engage into a discourse on diversity and potential re-definitions of "Germanness" (needless to say, there is very little consensus about the issue). In contrast, Anglophone countries such as the UK, Canada and the US, which have longer history of migration and intermarriage between individuals of different origins, have produced a variety of literary discourses on bi-national families. Literary superstars like Zadie Smith and Hanif Kureishi are only the tip of the iceberg. Lesser known figures like the British filmmaker Ayub Khan-Din, the Canadian novelist Nalo Hopkinson, or the US-American scriptwriter Nisha Ganatra have similarly re-written the traditional monoethnic, heterosexual family. This seminar will introduce some landmark novels and films about the bi-national families addressing issues such as ethnicity and racism, nationality, class and gender. We will also discuss how these narratives can be fruitfully taught in a German high-school classroom.

Lernziele

The proseminar will explore the foundations and characteristic traits of storytelling traditions as a fundamental practice of cultural and literary production. We will touch on the history of storytelling in America, ranging from oral performance to the literary conventions of canonized short stories of the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The theories and features enable us to contextualize late twentieth- and 21st-century innovations, e.g. the visual strategies in graphic narrative and the interactive potential in contemporary digital narrative formats. Have they changed the roles of authors and audiences? Have new media fundamentally changed the ways we tell and receive stories? Are we witnessing the emergence of a new storytelling culture?

Inhalte

How important, exactly, is it in our digital age, to understand the nature, history/ies and practices of storytelling? If we are to believe Joan Didion, they are central to our existence, as "we tell ourselves stories in order to live." From a cultural anthropological perspective, stories are told to explain the world, to link past and present, and to create a bond between teller and listener in acts of narrative performance. Storytelling theories propose intricate interrelations of story, interpretive community, and cultural context. Do such assumptions still hold for 21st-century storytelling?

Inhalte

This course will explore the U.S. presidential election process and the interactions among presidential candidates, parties, media, the campaign industry, and voters during campaigns. Using the 2016 presidential elections as a framework, we will study the systems and dynamics influencing voting, political communication, public opinion, and political participation, and analyze media reporting, candidates positioning and messaging, and opinion polling. Questions the course will explore include: What can the 2016 presidential election teach us about the United States political and electoral system and how it influences policy outcomes? How and why has the U.S. system of politics evolved over time? What is the role of corporations and the super rich in Presidential elections? How and why do leftwing or rightwing candidates succeed or fail? Why is the rate of voter participation in Presidential elections so low compared to peer nations? What are the unique characteristics of the 2016 presidential elections and what are the implications for the future of American politics? Special attention will be given to emerging topics in the recent presidential campaign. The course will place intensive focus on the elections prior to election day and the outcome of the election on the US political system as a whole after election day.

Inhalte

The digital turn of popular cinema may count among the most radical changes in the 21st century mediascape. Digital imaging, digital special effects and 3D have had profound effects on the production and distribution processes, on cinematography and narrative form, genre distinctions, and, not least, the theatre-going experience. This class sets out to explore the negotiations of human heroism in emphatically digital environments across various genres. We will discuss languages and functions of the heroic in popular culture, especially as they intersect with spectacular aesthetics, modes of astonishment and audience immersion. At the same time, we will look at the more general cultural implications of the digital film industry, and work on essential skills of film analysis.

Starting from the inflections of (human?) heroism in *Ex_Machina* (2015), we will move on to in-depth studies of *Avatar* (2009) and *Gravity* (2013), analyse ›epic‹ historical films from *Gladiator* (2000) to *Pompeii* (2014), compare recent digital action hero(in)es (*Skyfall* (2012); *The Hunger Games: Catching Fire* (2013)), and add a quick side trip into the superhero genre.

Please note that this class entails a fair amount of theoretical reading.

Inhalte

In this course, students will learn about the Revisionist and Neo-Western film genres, exploring the origins of the genre, how they have developed, and what their cultural impact has been on both a national and a global scale. As a genre, the Western has been one of the most popular and romanticized within US culture since its origins with Owen Wister. Since then, the basis of the genre has undergone rapid shifts to acclimate to the changing cultural attitudes within the United States, most notably in the later Revisionist and more contemporary Neo-Western genres. The Revisionist Western, seeking to transform the formula western into a critique on US American culture and normative processes, reflected the self-awareness US Americans held following the Civil Rights movement and the Vietnam war. The Neo-Western took this further, incorporating a variety of other genres (such as sci-fi, fantasy, horror, comedy and others), and continues to hold influence today on the development of the Western and the criticism it provides for contemporary US American culture.

Inhalte

While today, Rossetti maidens and roses are the standard kitsch of British museum shops, The Pre-Raphaelite poets and painters are often considered the first artistic “avant-garde” in Victorian Britain. These poets and artists, in their aim to position their work against the artistic mainstream of early Victorianism, reflect currents of the Victorian age both in their aesthetics as well as their themes. A Victorian culture caught between “muscular Christianity” and scientific explosions in all fields, the change of Britain by imperial expansion and industrialization paradoxically prompted in these artists an ideological withdrawal into an idealized European medieval past - at the heights of modernization. At the same time, also social topics found expression in their art and their aesthetics of the “natural”. The female figures in male poets’ and artists’ work, but foremost the poetry of Christina Rossetti reflect the tension concerning reified gender roles in a changing society. Pre-Raphaelite aesthetics found expression through a strong interest in intermedial and intertextual techniques: paintings quote poems, pictures reflect figures and themes of literature in a determination to inscribe the new art into a newly configured legacy of the past. The course unfold these topics via the discussion of poetry and selected paintings in a connection with broader cultural currents. We will focus on the influence of John Ruskin’s aesthetic ideology on his mentees, the pictorial and poetic work of Dante Gabriel Rossetti and focus on gender and spirituality in the poems of Christina Rossetti. The course provides the possibility to work with aspects of Victorian culture and society, intermedial and poetry analysis.

Inhalte

Dystopian narratives often imagine bleak, post-apocalyptic futures that are controlled by a totalitarian regime, which allocates privileges to a small elite while exposing the majority to economic distress, environmental disaster, and soul-crushing surveillance. To preempt disobedience and non-conformity, these imagined dystopian societies uphold a dysfunctional system through police violence or subtler forms of manipulation. Discontent is eliminated by perpetual drug use and/or propagandistic media thereby solidifying an essentially exploitative system.

To examine the aesthetics and politics of the dystopian impulse, this Graduate seminar will consider a wide range of fictional texts including short stories, novels, graphic novels, and films as well as non-fictional meditations on the state of the future. We will also consider how these frightening future scenarios articulate a critical response to contemporary events and issues. Moreover, we will investigate if and how these fictional constructions of precarious communities inform visions of an alternative future.

Inhalte

For the past two decades, the object matter of culture has received renewed attention in the study and theorizing of culture(s). Apparently, things are all over the place: they figure in narration, in human interrelations, in political activism, in public space and institutions. They are present: as novelties, as commodities, as rallying points and as heritage. They make us do things. They influence the ways we express or control our feelings, interact with our fellow human beings, and, eventually, build knowledge of ourselves and others. They combine the apparently concrete and the fleetingly abstract. The graduate seminar explores the theoretical underpinnings of this most recent shift in cultural theory and traces its relations to theories of American Studies. It is aimed at understanding how the world of (American) objects reflects on and produces attitudes and significance that we ascribe to cultures and societies. Apart from committing to theory, the seminar is intended to prepare students to participate in the upcoming FRIAS conference (MatteRealities) and also includes visits to nearby museum collections.

The study of material culture is of central concern in anthropology, art history, museum studies and memory studies, where artifacts are taken as register, legacy and archive of human activity. The matters of culture, generally read as the tangible expressions of everyday realities, are characterized by a semiotic polyvalence and categorial openness which suggests to investigate them from a decidedly interdisciplinary cultural studies angle. More than thirty years after Jules David Prown's seminal "Mind in Matter" (1982), it seems necessary in the face of the ever-increasing digitization of everyday-life practices to assess the potential of objectivized culture for a reconstruction of lived practice. I maintain that the study of material culture offers potential alternative avenues in the formation of knowledge – through sensual interaction with 'the tangible,' through exploration of the experiential, through a novel engagement with the presence of things. The seminar is designed to test this hypothesis about the historical, socio-political, and epistemological implications of materiality.

Inhalte

Known for its cultural diversity and vibrancy, the city of New York captures the American spirit. We study, and later visit, the Big Apple to explore fundamental trends within American culture, past and present. This graduate seminar examines a range of topics (e.g. independence, immigration, 9/11, gentrification) and artistic representations (in music, literature, architecture, poetry, painting) as well as past artistic movements (think Harlem Renaissance, the Beat Generation, Video and Street Art).

This MS/MS is mandatory for those, who intend to join the excursion to Manhattan in 2017, but it can also be taken independently (GymPO students receive cultural studies credits, HS mit Unterrichtsbezug); BA and MA students receive cultural studies and "Ergänzungsbereich"-credits). It is required that participants have read all texts before the start of the seminar.

Inhalte

The Seminar will cut a route through British fiction of the 20th and 21st centuries that deals with the topic of surveillance as it reflects various discourses in British culture in the last hundred years. Starting with Rudyard Kipling's novel of a little Anglo-Indian boy who becomes implicated in the important role of surveillance as a part of the "great game" of Imperialism (*Kim*, 1901), we will move to George Orwell's classic of a dystopian surveillance society, *1984* (1948) and discuss its implications with fears prevalent after the Second World War. Muriel Spark's satire *The Abbess of Crewe* (1974) makes links to the Watergate scandal, invents a micro-social lifeworld soaked with surveillance technology and plays with its farcical use for power games. J.G. Ballard's *Super-Cannes* (2000) presents surveillance as a constitutive part of the life-world of a gated community of the super-rich. Lastly, Andrea Arnold's surveillance film *Red Road* (2006) provides a rich tableaux of topics connected to contemporary Britain, narrated with the use of surveillance cameras. The seminar will consist of close readings of the fictions, and discuss how the topic of surveillance interacts with political and ideological changes in modern British history.

Inhalte

Magazines were a defining and highly popular medium of nineteenth-century Britain. They targeted readers of all genders and age groups, commented on the present and the past, and addressed a wide range of cultural interests, anxieties and desires. This class focuses on the fact that Victorian magazines were an important medium for shaping their readers' knowledge about and attitudes towards the world abroad—a world they encountered as tourists, explorers, soldiers, missionaries, builders of empire or simply as armchair travellers. How did the Victorians perceive countries like Germany, France, Russia or the United States? How were they advised to travel these countries (for example the Black Forest)? How did they justify their rule over other countries and people? Did women travel with a different outlook than men, and were female readers presented with a special image of the world abroad? The seminar will address such and other questions for some of the most popular and influential magazines of Victorian Britain: Charles Dickens's *Household Words*, *The Leisure Hour*, *Good Words* and *The Ladies' Treasury*. Apart from our special interest, we will discuss general features of 19th-century print culture and compare British and German magazines (such as the famous *Gartenlaube*). The class will include a special workshop with Professor Brian Maidment on the role of illustrations in Victorian periodicals.

Participants of the class will have the opportunity to develop parts of an exhibition project on travel in nineteenth-century magazines that will be presented in the University Library in July and August 2017.

Lehrmethoden

Regular readings (mostly short texts) will provide the basis for debate and discussion on Canada's "model" of multiculturalism and its role in shaping Canadian identity. Although the focus will be on written texts that are not usually discussed in literature courses—after all, critical analysis of such "everyday" texts is no less important than that of "classic" literature—, we will also look at other media such as radio and TV, video clips, very likely a song or two or even a poem or a short story.

Inhalte

With roughly 4 in 10 Canadian residents either foreign-born or having at least one foreign-born parent, perhaps it's not surprising that Canada was the first country in the world to adopt multiculturalism as official policy; yet Canada's commitment to multiculturalism has been anything but a given and continues to be debated. In this course we will explore Canadian articulations—and critiques—of multiculturalism through a variety of historical and contemporary texts and media. Our focus will be on what linguists call "pragmatic competence": In order to understand a text and respond to it critically, you need to know more than just what the words mean—you need to understand the relationship between the text and its context, its author, its medium, and its audience. What makes the difference between a newspaper op-ed, a magazine essay, a parliamentary speech, a radio talk show, or a government report—to name a few? What "rules" (as social practices) do the authors follow in the production of each kind of text and how do these "shape" the message? What is the relationship between the form and the intent of the text?
